(7-0-0-0) Councilman Gibson, Councilman Kolodziej, Councilman Latona, Councilwoman Murphy, Councilwoman Pino, Councilwoman Sadrakula and Mayor Grabowski voted aye.

CITY MANAGER PRIVILEGE

City Manager, Dominick Villano, advise Council of a conference call with the consultants working on Third River Project. Council had previously agreed to a two-month extension to complete the study. He stated that the study will be completed by July 1, 2023. He also advised Council that four families have signed up with FEMA to have their houses bought. He also advised that a new program is in effect wherein families can sign up to receive \$300,000 to raise their houses.

Mr. Villano discussed Councilwoman Sadrakula's request regarding sidewalks being put in on Mt. Prospect Street and Allwood Place for all new construction. Mr. Villano stated that he will have a break-down of all properties, along with a cover memo, at the next meeting. Councilwoman Sadrakula asked for a copy of the letters that were sent to the residents of these properties. Mr. Villano stated that the City Engineer will be sending letters shortly and that he would give her a copy of same when completed.

FLOOR TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Gary Perino, 491 Mt. Prospect Ave., reported a problem he is having with Channel 77 on Optimum and he spoke about a walking tour in Branch Brook Park and how nice it would be to have the same thing on City Hall property. He spoke about enforcing City Ordinances regarding sidewalks.

Steve Goldberg, 124 Charles St., discussed the way the Members of the Civil Rights Commission are appointed. He spoke about the importance of vetting the Members. He announced the upcoming Israeli Flag Raising and read a passage about Amir Khoury who died assisting the people of Israel. He wished all a Happy Passover, Blessed Easter and Peaceful Ramadan.

Joseph Saino, 102 Trenton Ave., he spoke about the City's Ordinance regarding the placement of Realtor signs. He agreed that the Members of the Civil Rights Commission should be subject to a background check.

Anthony Miragliotta, 31 John Alden St., asked if the audit of improper pay and sick time to City Employees was ever complete. He asked how any improper payments would be recouped. He remarked on the budget, tax increases, waiving taxes for disabled veterans, open building permits, temporary Certificates of Occupancy and the recent theft of wired funds that was experienced by the City of Clifton.

Julie Krygsman, 49 Viola Ave., discussed several disturbing incidents that have taken place around her home where she was in need of police assistance such as suspicious persons, drug paraphernalia left on her property, people smoking in their cars, littering and many other occurrences. She spoke particularly of the last incident where a Clifton Police Officer responded and basically told her nothing could be done to help her. Ms. Krygsman claimed he was rude, uncaring and spoke badly about the Clifton Police and the town in general. She asked Council to help with the situation.

Wes Krygsman, 49 Viola Ave., remarked on understaffed and overworked Police Department in Clifton and the need to hire quality police officers. He spoke about the many incidents his wife, Julie Krygsman, discussed at tonight's meeting. Mr. Krygsman spoke about finding ways to make the streets safer and asked the police be more proactive in their approach to safety.

Bart Ciervo, 306 Delawanna Ave., spoke about a business that has windows covered by paper for quite a while and wanted to know what was being planned for the building. He stated that telephone poles do not belong to the City and no one should post signs on them. He warned council to look into requirements before allowing residents to raise houses in flood areas. He spoke about having police patrol in the area of Delawanna Avenue and poor police response.

Judy Bassford, 92 Mountain View Dr., announced a memorial service which will be held for the victims of 9/11. She expressed her regret to the Krygsman on their quality of life issue and spoke about a bad joke she recently heard at a meeting of diverse citizens.

With no one else wishing to be heard, a Motion was made by Councilwoman Sadrakula, seconded by Councilwoman Murphy, and passed on roll call vote, to close public session.

(6-0-0-1) Councilman Gibson, Councilman Latona, Councilwoman Murphy, Councilwoman Pino, Councilwoman Sadrakula and Mayor Grabowski voted aye. Councilman Kolodziej was absent.

COUNCIL PRIVILEGE

Councilman Gibson

Councilman Gibson discussed placing mini-markets at the Clifton Animal Shelter and the Senior Citizen Barn. He spoke about funding the improvements in Nash Park with a Green Space Grant. City Manager, Dominick Villano, remarked that an application was submitted to Green Acres because their funding is for a higher amount. He asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, if any City Employees are still working from home. Mr. Villano stated that all employees are back in the office full time with the exception of certain circumstances. Councilman Gibson spoke about the need to follow the sidewalk Ordinance for all City properties. He wished all that celebrate a Happy Passover. Councilman Gibson expressed his disdain for the quality of life situation the Krygsman family is experiencing.

Councilman Kolodziej

Councilman Kolodziej spoke about State Laws in NJ that do not allow the municipality to recoup funds that are already spent. He stated that he is in favor of raising taxes to plant more trees but would rather see the City apply for grants. Councilman Kolodziej reference recouping funds from schools and the County. He proposed establishing an Open Space Tax. Councilman Kolodziej expressed his disappointment in the treatment the Krygman Family received regarding their quality of life issue and remarked that he was sure Administration will be investigating the incident quickly and in detail. He remarked on the shortage of police in the City. Councilman Kolodziej discussed special interest firms interviewing for RFP's who did not even meet the qualifications of the proposal. He spoke about the recent budget meetings and stated that many good ideas were brought up, but many of them had nothing to do with the budget. Councilman Kolodziej remarked that a rumor that was being spread regarding residents obtaining temporary Certificates of Occupancy to avoid paying taxes, was not true. He spoke about the many budget troubles the City is facing.

Councilman Latona

Councilman Latona discussed the upkeep of the Cable network, sidewalks, disabled veterans and tax reimbursements, checks and balances, the quality of life issue the Krygsman family is experiencing, the City's sign ordinance. Good luck to Little League. He announced that loss of several helicopter pilots who died in a training session. Councilman Latona spoke about the Budget Meeting being televised for the public. He discussed his suggestions to balance the budget. Councilman Latona expressed that he is not in favor of raising taxes and spoke about governmental transparency. Happy Easter to all that celebrate.

Councilwoman Murphy

Councilwoman Murphy apologized to the Krygsman family for the disappointing experience they had with a member of the Clifton Police Department. She announced Recreation news, a fundraiser at Bruno's Restaurant, Shred Day, an upcoming Action Clifton meeting, St. Peter's 5k Run and the availability of the CHIP Program to residents. Councilwoman Murphy announced that April is Autism Awareness Month. She wished all a Happy Easter, Passover and Ramadan.

Councilwoman Pino

Councilwoman Pino apologized to the Krygsman family for the upsetting experience they had with a Clifton Police Officer during a quality of life complaint. She expressed that she was not comfortable with interviewing law firms for outside counsel by Zoom. She announced the Grand Opening of a new Salon. She congratulated the PCTI Theater on their production of Mary Poppins. She congratulated the City of Passaic on their 150th Anniversary. She spoke about the Council's effort to produce a balanced budget. She congratulated the Board of Education for the new Tennis Court. She spoke about a Town Hall meeting she held regarding the CHIP Program. She urged residents to check her Facebook page for more information.

Councilwoman Sadrakula

Councilwoman Sadrakula asked if a "No Loitering" sign can be placed on Jewett Street next to the Krygsman family home. She then spoke about the Table of Organization in the Police Department. The Councilwoman spoke regarding the fraudulent \$600,000 payment, Allwood Place sidewalks. She suggested a fundraiser for planting cherry blossom trees on City Hall property. Councilwoman Sadrakula spoke regarding temporary Certificates of Occupancy. She asked if the markings on Allwood Road were for gas and water. She spoke regarding the restaurant building on Delawanna and asked for an emergency order on Delawanna. She asked the Legal Department how much was paid regarding the Palma lawsuit to date. She wished everyone a Happy Easter, Passover and Ramadan.

Mayor Grabowski

Mayor Grabowski discussed increases in garbage collection, recycling collection as well as Police Department salary increases. He indicated that we have had Budget meetings and hopefully we will come to an agreement on the Budget. He discussed the situation at the Krygsman home. He wished everyone a Happy Easter, Passover and Ramadan.

R186-23 Resolution Authorizing and Ratifying Emergency Repairs at the Martin Avenue Pump Station

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND RATIFYING EMERGENCY REPAIRS AT THE MARTIN AVENUE PUMP STATION

WHEREAS, a report, dated December 6, 2021 was submitted to the City Manager by City Engineer Michael J. Lardner, which summarized the emergency repairs required at the Martin Avenue Pump Station; and

WHEREAS, the report notes that the City Engineer received an alarm that the variable flow drive for Pumps 1 and 3 had failed; and
