The entitled ordinance was introduced and read by the City Clerk, as first reading, which reading was by title, passed upon motion made by Councilman Gibson, seconded by Councilwoman Murphy and carried by roll call vote.

An Ordinance to Amend, Revise and Supplement Chapter 77 of the Code of the City of Clifton, Entitled "Police Department" (Amends Table of Organization in Police Department)

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the ordinance now pending be further considered for final passage after public hearing at the regular meeting of the Municipal Council to be held Tuesday, June 15, 2021 at 8:00 p.m. and that the City Clerk be authorized to publish said ordinance together with statutory notice as required by law.

CITY MANAGER PRIVILEGE

City Manager, Dominick Villano, announced that City Hall would fully reopen on July 6, 2021. He said that the call-in number for the public to use for City Council meetings will no longer be available starting the first meeting in July. Mr. Villano spoke about a meeting he had with Passaic Mayor, Hector Lora, regarding the installation of sidewalks on Dwasline Road.

FLOOR TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Sadrakula left the dais at 8:19 p.m.

Morris Yamner, 330 Dwasline Road, stated that many people in the audience have come to give their opinions on the Dwasline Road sidewalk installation, but since the item is not on the agenda to be discussed, they will come back when the item is on the agenda.

Councilwoman Sadrakula returned to the dais at 8:20 p.m.

Einar Einarrson, 30 Woodlawn Ave., spoke about flooding from the Third River.

Paula Kos, 22 E Third St., spoke about the proposed name change and the hardships it would cause the residents of E. Third Street to John Samra Way.

Councilwoman Murphy left the dais at 8:37 p.m.

William Goldberg, 350 Dwasline Road, spoke about the proposed installation of sidewalks on Dwasline Road.

Councilwoman Murphy returned to the dais at 8:41 p.m.

Ray Lill, 59 Stevens Road, spoke about the disadvantages that the sale of cannabis would be to Clifton.

With no one else wishing to be heard, a Motion was made by Councilman Grabowski, seconded by Councilwoman Murphy and passed on roll call vote to close the public session.

(6-0-0-1) Councilman Gibson, Councilman Grabowski, Councilwoman Murphy, Councilwoman Pino, Councilwoman Sadrakula and Mayor Anzaldi voted aye. Councilman Eagler was absent.

A discussion took place regarding flooding from the Third River and in other areas in the City. City Manager, Dominick Villano, stated that he has contacted the State and also the DEP asking for assistance or grants to help with the situation. A suggestion was made to identify all areas that have flood issues in the City and bring the study to the Federal Government for help. Mr. Villano stated that the Federal Government does not fund studies. He suggested a long-term bond or possibly locating a provision in the Cares Act fund to finance the study. Direction was given to obtain a quote for a study of all areas that have flooding problems. Council asked that this item be put on the next agenda for further discussion.

A discussion took place regarding a plan to separate skateboards, bicycles and scooters and the use of protective gear at the City Skate Park.

A discussion took place regarding the sale of cannabis in Clifton. Direction was given to contact nearby municipalities and ask what their experiences have been. Council also talked about having a non-binding question regarding the sale of cannabis put before the public. City Attorney, Matthew Priore, stated that he would research a non-binding question but doubts that it could be accomplished before the August deadline. Council asked that this item be put on the next agenda for further discussion.

COUNCIL PRIVILEGE

Councilman Grabowski

Councilman Grabowski spoke about the Skate Park rules regarding protective equipment. He discussed naming the street that enters James Anzaldi Park, James Samra Way, as an alternative to honor Police Officer John Samra. He spoke about the sale of cannabis in Clifton and the lack of testing of cannabis in DUI situations. He thanked everyone who was involved putting together the Memorial Day celebration.

Councilwoman Murphy

Councilwoman Murphy suggested naming the fieldhouse in James Anzaldi Park as an alternative to renaming East Third Street to honor police officer, John Samra. She announced that the Board of Elections is in need of poll workers. Councilwoman Murphy thanked all the residents who provided input regarding the sale of cannabis in Clifton. She remarked that the Memorial Day services were pleasant and had a good turnout.

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Councilwoman Pino

Councilwoman Pino remarked on the way the council meeting videos are posted on the City website and asked the format to be changed to make finding the videos easier. She thanked everyone who worked on the Memorial Day services. Councilwoman Pino announced that she would not be able to attend the Pride flag raising event. She announced the Clifton Theater League's upcoming performance of Jesus Christ Superstar.

Councilwoman Sadrakula

Councilwoman Sadrakula asked City Manager, Dominick Villano, to provide a breakdown on Covid-19 vaccinations per month and all outside counsel invoices for last year to be provided at the next Council meeting. She spoke about the Skate Park rules and hours, flooding on Woodlawn Avenue and Clifton Avenue and the sale of cannabis in Clifton. Councilwoman Sadrakula remarked on a piece CBS News New York did on the Avenue of Flags. She thanked everyone involved in setting up the Memorial Day celebration. Councilwoman Sadrakula spoke about installing flashing signs on Haddonfield Road and potholes on Routes 3 and 46.

Councilman Eagler

Councilman Eagler was absent.

Councilman Gibson

Councilman Gibson announced that City Hall will reopen at full staff on July 6, 2021. He spoke about getting feedback from the Mayor of Passaic regarding the installation of sidewalks on Dwasline Road. Councilman Gibson remarked that it was good to discuss some alternatives to renaming East Third Street to honor police officer, John Samra, and that many good alternate suggestions were put before Council.

Councilwoman Pino left the dais at 9:43 p.m.

Councilman Gibson spoke about the flooding on Woodlawn Avenue and the importance of wearing helmets in the Skate Park. He thanked everyone that was involved and attended the Memorial Day parade.

Councilwoman Pino returned to the dais at 9:47 p.m.

Mayor Anzaldi

Mayor Anzaldi thanked everyone who helped put together the Memorial Day services. He announced the upcoming Tank Pull, Flag Day, the Clifton Mustang Band Tricky Tray and the Dutch Hill Flea Market.

R265-21 Resolution Approving Changes of Income Requirements for the Clifton Home Improvement Program (CHIP)

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RESOLUTION APPROVING CHANGES IN INCOME REQUIREMENTS FOR CLIFTON HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CHIP) LOANS

WHEREAS, on October 7, 1975, the City of Clifton established the program known as the Clifton Home Improvement Program (CHIP); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the program is to make available certain federal funds to enable citizens of the City of Clifton to rehabilitate their homes; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Clifton Housing Department, pursuant to the guidelines of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, to make rehabilitation loans available to the residents of the City of Clifton on a more equitable basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Municipal Council of the City of Clifton, that the Clifton Housing Department, within its Clifton Home Improvement Program, approves the changes in income requirements for CHIP loans based on the Uncapped Income Limits as provided by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for gross income and size of family according to the following chart :

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDING PURSUANT TO THE NEW JERSEY LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION BOND ACT AND INTENT TO MATCH

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act has made 1:1 matching grant funds available to New Jersey Public Libraries; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Clifton, together with the Clifton Public Library Board of Trustees (the Library Board) on behalf of the Clifton Public Library, wish to apply to the New Jersey State Library for funding under the Library Construction Bond Act Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Clifton and the Library Board hereby certify that permission has been granted to apply for the project entitled the New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act, in the amount of \$189,150.00; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clifton will provide the required 1:1 local match of up to \$189,150.00, which is one-half the amount of the project’s total estimated cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Clifton, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, that:

1. The City is hereby authorized, and permission is hereby granted for the City, to join in an application with the Clifton Public Library, pursuant to the New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act, for grant funding from the New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act Fund, in the amount of \$189,150.00, and for the City to provide the required matching grant funding; and
2. The City will provide a detailed listing of the source(s) and amount(s) of the matching funds; and
3. Upon award, the City of Clifton will accept the grant funds, for the benefit of the Clifton Public Library, for the purpose(s) described in its application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and/or City Manager are hereby authorized to complete, sign and, together with the Clifton Library Board of Trustees, on behalf of the Clifton Public Library, submit a grant application for the program identified herein.

MEDICAL BILLING SERVICES FOR THE CITY OF CLIFTON**

WHEREAS, the City requires a Medical Billing Service in order to be reimbursed for expenses related to the Vaccination Clinics that were never eligible under the CARES Act and were expensed prior to being eligible under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

WHEREAS, All the vaccination clinic costs, both payroll and non-payroll expenses, not paid for with CDBG Funding, up until March 3, 2021 were and are be paid for from the Storm Emergency (Snow) Trust Account as authorized by the State and City Council and a billing Company is needed to assist the City in recouping a portion of these expenses, the overall value and cost of which shall exceed the bid threshold; and,

WHEREAS, in order to obtain medical billing services, the City will be required to issue a bid in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 *et seq.*;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Municipal Council of the City of Clifton that the Purchasing Agent is authorized to advertise for bids for Medical Billing Services and to receive and publicly open bids for the goods and services described herein; and,
